The Dun Laoghaire Rathdown Public Participation Network (DLR PPN) is the umbrella network of Community & Voluntary, Social Inclusion and Environmental groups in Dun Laoghaire-Rathdown. Membership is diverse and includes local community and volunteer groups such as active retirement groups, men's sheds, residents' associations, scout and guide groups, chess and bridge clubs, sporting, as well as environmental and social inclusion groups operating in DLR county.


Member groups are provided with opportunities for networking, learning, communication and sharing of information which leads to participation in local decision making and collective action. Free training is open to all our members in areas such as digital skills & technology, governance, committee skills, and funding. Regular workshops, linkage groups and public consultation meetings are held to ensure that members' voices are heard. Representatives [REPS] sit on the local government committees which cover these policy areas: Community, Culture & Wellbeing, Economic Development and Enterprise, Environment and Climate Action, Housing, Planning and Transportation and Marine Strategic Policy Committees and the Local Community Development Committee.

Our aims are:

- To facilitate communication between community groups and DLR County Council.
- To give voice to a diverse range of views and interests within the local government system and participate in policy making.
- To strengthen the ability of people, via structured groups and organisations, to contribute in a positive way to the community in which they reside or are active within.
- To act as an information hub for local community and voluntary, environmental, and social inclusion groups and organisations.

• To actively support the local community during challenging times e.g as a member of the local Community Stakeholder Forum during the initial stages of the pandemic.

The DLR PPN membership is divided into three categories called pillars-Community & Voluntary, Social Inclusion and Environment. 

## Membership





#### **Climate Conversations Workshop and Report**



The Climate Conversations have been designed to ensure reach to as broad and wide-ranging an audience as possible across the whole of Ireland. In June 2022 we held our DLR PPN Climate Conversation where the participants discussed the following themes:

- **Climate Literacy** Understanding how aware public groups are of what needs to be done/ what can be done and how to do it to achieve carbon neutrality.
- Just Transition Understanding where government and local authorities need to be providing support to ensure that the transition to climate neutrality is fair equitable and inclusive.
- **Transport and Travel** How do people in your area get around? What are people doing to reduce their climate impact from travel? If so, what motivates you? What are the main barriers from travelling more sustainably?
- **Energy** a) Homes & Retrofitting, b) Offshore Generation What people are doing at home with regards to retrofitting and upgrading existing houses to improve energy efficiency. What is the public sentiment towards Offshore Generation.

 Food, Waste & Retail (Circular Economy) - Supporting Ireland to move towards a more circular economy, by making products that last longer and can be repurposed. Initiatives in your area – what you'd like to see, what works well, what you'd be willing to do to reuse and recycle more.

Feedback was gathered and the report generated was submitted to the Department of Environment Climate and Communications.



#### **Stepping Stones to Energy Efficiency**

# DLR PPN Vision for Community Wellbeing

In December 2022 the DLR Public Participation Network launched its Vision Statement for Community Wellbeing including key findings and themes communicated by their members.

The report, mandated by the Department of Rural and Community Development, identifies core issues that member groups and the wider DLR community consider important for their community to be "The best that it can be for this and future generations".

Key Findings:

- Taking care of our natural assets parks, coast, heritage, etc. in the county from both an environmental and asset preservation perspective.
- Community places and resources.
- Transparency in local government with good communication and engagement.
- Inclusion Age, youth, and disability inclusion coming out strongest.
- Encouraging Volunteerism especially youth volunteerism.

With 568 Member groups in Dún Laoghaire Rathdown PPN and 32 Reps on County Committees here, this Community Wellbeing Statement is representative of the feelings and aspirations of citizens of our county.

The findings, which were responded to under 6 headings, all have common threads as can be seen! Threads which DLR PPN, its secretariat, and indeed its members will gladly want to be highlighted, at both local and national level. *Health, Physical and Mental. Social and Community Development. Participation Democracy and Governance. Values Culture and meaning. Economy & Resources. Environment and Sustainability*  These findings, representative of everyone in Dún Laoghaire Rathdown, will come as no surprise to most of our citizens. These issues and the search for Community Wellbeing has been expedited by community issues around Covid, and how the community responded, both individually and as groups, to coping with Covid and its continued aftermath.

#### How did we do this?

The consultation period ran from the 27th of September 2021 to the 8th of November 2021. During the consultation period, we hosted a series of 9 workshops with over 70 participants and launched a survey that received over 330 submissions. In Spring 2022 a further consultation period was held this ran from 13th April to 4th May 2022 where we sought feedback on the Draft Vision and invited members and the people of Dun Laoghaire Rathdown to join one of the two online workshops which were held on, 26th & 28th April 2022 there was also the opportunity for those who could not attend to provide feedback by making a submission to an additional online survey or they could the print and complete the survey form and return it by post.
