
The Dun Laoghaire Rathdown Public Participation Network (DLR PPN) is the umbrella network of Community & Voluntary, Social Inclusion Environmental groups in Dun Laoghaire-Rathdown. Membership is diverse and includes local community and volunteer groups such as active retirement men's sheds, residents' groups, associations, scout and guide groups, chess and bridge clubs, sporting, as well as environmental and social inclusion groups operating in DLR county.

#### All our activities reflect the aims of the PPN:

- 1. To facilitate communication between community groups and the Local Authority.
- 2.To enable representatives from the community to sit on various decision-making committees within the Local Authority.
- 3. To increase capacity and good practices within the local community by providing relevant training.
- 4. To act as an information hub, keeping community groups informed of relevant initiatives and opportunities in DLR.
- 5. To support the community as needed (Community Response Forum and other).

#### What we don't do:

- We do not provide funding, sponsorships or loans.
- We do not manage or have access to the funding set in place by the dlr County Council or other organisations.
- We do not have direct influence in executive or operational decisions made by the dlr County Council with respect to their service (e.g. parks maintenance)
- We are not political.
- We do not run the DLR Times printed publication.
- We are not directly involved in the drafting of any of the dlr County Council's local plans, Annual Service Plans, Budget, etc.



Member groups are provided with opportunities for networking, learning, communication and sharing of information which leads to participation in local decision-making and collective action. Free training is open to all our members in areas such as digital skills & technology, governance, committee skills, and funding. Regular workshops, information sessions, as well as networking and public consultation meetings are held to ensure that members' voices are heard. DLR PPN Representatives (REPS) sit on the local government committees which cover these policy areas: Community, Culture & Wellbeing, Economic Development and Enterprise, Environment and Climate Action, Housing, Planning and Transportation and Marine Strategic Policy Committees, the Local Community Development Committee, Joint Policing Forum and the dlr Age Friendly Forum.

Membership is free to groups in the Dun Laoghaire Rathdown area who fulfil the membership criteria. All ages and abilities are welcome.

The DLR PPN membership is divided into three categories called pillars:

- Community & Voluntary
- Social Inclusion
- Environment

The activities are overseen by a Secretariat of 9 members, elected by groups who enjoy full membership of the network. Representatives are elected by the pillar members to Dun Laoghaire-Rathdown County Council committees and boards.

The DLR PPN identifies issues that matter and, through member input, it seeks to influence policy in a way that improves the quality of life and opportunities for people within the Local Authority area of Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown.

DLR PPN is committed to working in an open, inclusive, and transparent manner on behalf of all member groups.

2023 — A Year of Reconnecting Through Participation

Dear Members,

This year we sought to re-establish connections through participation. Some of the highlights of the year include:

#### **New Website**

The new website was launched, with one particular change being the inclusion of a <u>Members' Directory</u>. This is of benefit to the member groups as it provides a platform for them to promote their organisation, including a summary or description of their organisation, and details on how they can be contacted and where they are located.

We would encourage all member groups to visit this area of the website to ensure that their details are up to date. We encourage groups to provide group email addresses and contact details rather than personal ones as they are subject to GDPR. If you wish to provide a meeting location, this can be displayed on a map in the directory. An example of a fully completed directory entry is the one for Purple House Cancer Support.

#### **DLR PPN Member Network Meetings (Plenary)**

2023 was the first time since the pandemic when we found ourselves in a position where it was possible to hold two DLR PN Members Network Meetings in person (the first was held in April, the second in November). We are delighted to say there was an increase in numbers attending, which is particularly evident in the Autumn Plenary.

#### Representatives

The theme of the work undertaken by the Representatives in 2023 was Reconnecting and Establishing Connection (post Covid). A representatives' Buddy System for new representatives was established.

#### **Local Economic & Community Development Plan (LECP)**

DLR PPN was delighted to co-host a Social Inclusion workshop on the LEC plan for DLR County Council. DLR PPN made a submission to the plan on behalf of its members based on the feedback and ideas collected during the Vision for Community Wellbeing Project which led to the DLR PPN Vision Statement.

#### Training

Due to the greatly increased costs of providing training, and to broaden the range of training we could deliver, we partnered with Dublin City PPN for the Autumn training series. By doing this we were able to provide several short courses to members of both PPNs.

#### **Bealtaine Workshops**

In keeping with the theme of Reconnection through Participation, we used feedback received from our members to provide a tailored response to address the needs of older members of the community in relation to using technology in their everyday life. This led to a partnership with the Adult Education Service South-East. They designed the tailor-made training and in turn, invited DLR Libraires to participate, leading to three DLR county bodies partnering to answer the needs of their community.

#### And now for our *Thank Yous*

Firstly, a big 'Thank you' to our members who got involved and participated not only in the DLR community but also in PPN activities. Thank you to those who provided news items for the monthly ezine, attended our events, provided feedback and responded to our requests for input to surveys, etc. Thank you one and all.

Thank you to all who put yourselves forward for nomination to volunteer as representatives on the Local Government committees. Thank you to our DLR PPN Representatives who sit on the committees of the local decision-making bodies for giving your time and energy to represent the views of the DLR PPN member groups.

Thank you to The Adult Education Service South-East, Dublin City PPN, Anne Colgan and Gavin Harte for their collaboration in providing meaningful and informative training sessions and workshops for our members.

We wish to acknowledge and thank dlr County Council for its continued support and assistance, particularly the Community & Culture Department. Many thanks to Southside Partnership, our host organisation, for their continued support.

DLR PPN is run by a voluntary, dedicated Secretariat and is supported by committed staff members.

## DLR PPN Representatives



Our Representatives for this five-year term of Local Government faced unique challenges in that, soon after their election to the Local Government Committers (Strategic Policy, Local Community Development and Joint Policing Committees) we had to face the reality of a pandemic and the consequences of several lockdowns. This led, especially for first time representatives, to unprecedented obstacles in establishing connections and networking with their colleagues.

The Representatives Network meeting organised by the DLR PPN in December 2022 was the first time many of them met in person. It soon became apparent that the theme of work for their network meetings for 2023 should be 'Reconnecting and Establishing Connection (Post Covid)'.

In 2023 the DLR PPB Representatives attended local government committee meetings at least once each quarter, two hours in duration. SPCs meet 4 times each year, while other committees, such as the Local Community Development Committee, meet around 6 times per year.

The Representatives are responsible for completing a report after each meeting advising on the outcomes and seeking input from the membership if needed. This is a requirement of the Department of Rural and Community Development.



Additionally, the representatives attended three Representative Network Meetings since December 2022, organized by the DLR PPN, with a further meeting planned for February 2024.

As mentioned above, a
Representatives' Buddy System
with Secretariat members has been
established. It is hoped that this
will provide support for the new
Representatives after the 2024
local elections when the new
committees are established.

Representatives have been provided with a dedicated area on the DLR PPN website which contains useful resources. It is hoped to develop this area further in 2024.

## Staff

DLR PPN has two staff members, hosted by Southside Partnership DLR:

In 2023 staffing was not at full capacity between January and September due to Maternity leave. During that period, an Acting Network Manager was employed 4 days per week, and the role of Support worker was filled temporarily from mid-February to August for 18 hours per week.


## Membership



#### Training

In 2023 DLR PPN provided 24 hours of training for its member groups.

This training was provided to help strengthen the capacity of communities and of the environment, social inclusion, community and voluntary groups to contribute positively to the community in which they reside or participate.

Providing training for our members was challenging in 2023, due to encountering difficulties in sourcing trainers to deliver meaningful training to community and Voluntary groups and due to a significant increase in the cost of providing this training.

#### **Bealtaine Training Workshops**

Aware of the multiple challenges of using technology, rendered acute during the pandemic, DLR PPN wanted to provide additional tailored training to support older members of the community, in particular to those who feel challenged when using technology. The aim was to create training that they would find meaningful and could use daily to make it easier to access information and services and not to feel excluded.


The target audience, the older members of the DLR community, belonged to either or both categories below:

- ·People who learnt how to use technology during the lockdowns and are ready and interested in finding out more
- ·Others who have not been able to adapt the skills learnt during Covid and apply them to other uses

The DLR PPN approached the DDLETB Adult Education Service South-East (AES) with the germ of an idea. This fitted well with their remit to address Digital Literacy, and they explored how they could assist in supporting the older members of our community, by consulting with their trainers and staff to develop a new pilot programme of training delivered over several sessions.

They sought the assistance of DLR Libraries to participate in one of three workshops.

- How to Get More from Your Phone
- How to Get More from Your Library
- How to Use MyGov.ie



The workshops were intended as inclusive events where participants could feel comfortable learning. Each free workshop was facilitated by a tutor and supported by additional staff from the Adult Education Service. A presentation was delivered which included plenty of opportunities for learners to ask questions throughout. When the presentation was complete, learners were able to discuss any issues they were having individually with a member of the team. All participants were given a hard copy of the presentation and support material with additional tips and information. There was a social element too, as there was time for a cup of tea and a chat built into each workshop.

#### DLR Local Economic & Community Plan 2023 - 2028

The Local Economic and Community Plan (LECP) is a six-year plan that sets out the objectives and actions needed to promote the community and economic development of Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown's neighbourhoods and communities. It will give Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown County Council, businesses, community and voluntary groups, and local communities a roadmap to follow over the period to 2028.

DLR PPN co-hosted this workshop with Southside Partnership, providing members of the Social Inclusion Pillar and other organisations in DLR with the opportunity to feed back into the Local Economic and Community Plan 2023 to 2028.






#### Information Session - Community Climate Action Programme Funding

This is an entirely new funding initiative, and we were delighted to partner with DLR County Council in organising an information session on the 14th of November. The session was held online, via Zoom. A recording of the session was made available on our website and shared with our membership and beyond.

The Community Climate Action Programme is a new programme to support small and large, rural and urban communities to take climate action at a local level. Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown County Council, in conjunction with the Department of the Environment, Climate and Communications will support local communities to promote and assist in the scale up of community climate action. The overall objective of the programme is to shape and build low carbon, sustainable communities in a coherent way to contribute to national climate and energy.

## dlr Community Response Forum

DLR PPN is a member of dlr Community Response Forum which was established in 2022.

Building on structures and relationships which were highly effective during the early months of the COVID-19 pandemic, the Community Response Fora enable all those involved to work together under the stewardship of the local authority.

Supplementing the supports and services being provided by government agencies at a local level, their purpose is to ensure effective communication and information sharing in the coordination of local community and voluntary actions in providing community supports to the new Ukrainian communities.

Minister of State for Communities and Charities, Joe O'Brien, said: "Each Forum will work to harness the goodwill and assistance available within our communities, including the resources of the community and voluntary sector to manage offers of assistance to ensure that the often complex needs of those arriving are met."



DLR PPN were delighted to join the fellow colleagues from the Community Response Forum and Denis O'Callaghan, Cathaoirleach to welcome a delegation from Lithuania

This visit was aimed at providing learning opportunities and sharing our experiences. The DLR PPN has been part of the Community Stakeholder Forum from the very beginning in April 2020 and continues to provide support to the other agencies involved by raising awareness in the community about the initiatives available to support International Protection Applicants.





#### Spring Network Meeting - The Theme: 'Participation'

The Spring meeting took place on 27th April 2023 in County Hall, Dun Laoghaire. The theme of the evening was Participation. The evening opened with the governance section:

#### Autumn Meeting - The Theme 'Building for Our Future'

The DLR PPN Autumn Plenary Meeting took place on the 23rd of November 2023 in the Royal Marine Hotel, Dun Laoghaire. The theme of the meeting was Building for Our Future. We were delighted to welcome 80 participants on the night.

The evening opened with a brief time for networking for participants, followed by a short presentation about the PPN, for the benefit of newer members who might not be yet fully acquainted with what the PPN does and does not do.

This was then followed by a presentation on the DLR PPN Five Year Plan with facilitator Finbarr Fitzpatrick of Business Improvement Solutions. Participants were then invited to give their feedback about the first DLR PPN Five Year Plan 2024-2028 and to complete a survey submission to the plan.

The final part of the evening was an open call to the participants to share news or initiatives that might be of interest to the community. The meeting closed at 8.50pm.



## Public Participation Network National Conference 2023

- Two-day conference brought representatives from across Ireland together to discuss citizen engagement.
- Public Participation Networks (PPNs) give local communities a say in local government decisions.
- Over 18,500 groups across Ireland helping to 'Build a better future' through their involvement.

Minister of State with responsibility for Community Development, Charities and Integration, Joe O'Brien, T.D. attended the fifth National Public Participation Network Conference held in the Arklow Bay Hotel, Wicklow.



Addressing the delegates, Minister O'Brien spoke about the important contribution PPNs make: "PPNs are key partners in local decision making and are increasingly becoming the 'go-to' for community engagement. After all, who knows better than the citizens at the heart of our communities what is best for our communities and how to work together to achieve positive results."

The two-day conference event was hosted by Wicklow Public Participation Network, in conjunction with Wicklow County Council, the Department of Rural and Community Development and the National PPN Advisory Group. It was attended by a wide range of PPN stakeholders, including volunteer representatives from PPNs across the country, local authority officials, and elected representatives.

Minister O'Brien highlighted the value of the work done by PPNs in promoting citizen engagement and participative democracy:

"PPNs give communities access to decision-makers in a very unique way. They provide a voice for communities in local decision-making and create strong relationships between stakeholders."

The Minister continued: "Hundreds of PPN representatives currently sit on boards and committees of local decision-making bodies across the country, contributing to decisions on housing, climate, transport, migrant integration, community health and wellbeing, policing and many more. Your local knowledge is key to understanding and delivering information, support and practical solutions to issues in your areas. You are bringing the community voice to the table to help ensure no one is left behind."

Concluding the Minister said: "From my own perspective and that of my Department, one clear message I would like you all to take away from this conference is that we will continue our support of PPNs into the future. You are all, as our awareness campaign said, building a better future and better communities for everyone."

The conference, which was attended by over 200 delegates, had a varied and interesting agenda of workshops and presentations on, for example, collaborative projects between PPNs and Local Authorities, and innovative community schemes initiated by PPNs around the country. It also included site trips to a number of locations around Wicklow, where delegates met with local community organisations that are involved in and empowered by Wicklow PPN.

Dun Laoghaire Rathdown Participation Network participated with one of the largest number of representatives, including members of the Secretariat: Aileen Eglington, Kay Gleeson, Tony McCarthy, Sharon Perry and Siby Sebastian and DLR PPN staff Colette Downing and Simone Sav.

#### DLR PPN Five Year Plan 2024 - 2028 Consultation


