# About



## Public Participation Network DLR

The Dún Laoghaire–Rathdown Public Participation Network (DLR PPN) is a shared network that brings together community, voluntary, social inclusion and environmental groups across the Dún Laoghaire–Rathdown area.

DLR PPN is organised around three pillars – Community & Voluntary, Social Inclusion, and Environment – and is guided by an elected Secretariat. Its members range from active retirement groups, men’s sheds and residents’ associations to youth groups, sports clubs, and environmental and social inclusion organisations.

DLR PPN works to connect local community groups with the Local Authority, ensuring community voices are heard in local decision-making. The network nominates community representatives to participate in local decision making by sitting on dlr Local Authority committees and fora. It supports groups by offering free training, sharing information about local opportunities, and providing spaces for networking, learning and collaboration.

What DLR PPN does not do is provide funding, manage council grants, make operational decisions for the County Council, or engage in political activity. It is also not responsible for council publications or the drafting of local plans and budgets.

Members benefit from regular workshops, information sessions and consultations, as well as representation on a wide range of local committees covering areas such as community wellbeing, housing, environment and climate action, planning, transport, and policing.

Membership is free for eligible groups based in the area, and people of all ages and abilities are welcome.

DLR PPN is committed to being open, inclusive and transparent, and works to improve quality of life and opportunities for everyone in the Dún Laoghaire–Rathdown area.

# Secretariat

The Secretariat is the steering group of DLR PPN and is elected by the PPN membership. Secretariat members are committed volunteers who participate in monthly meetings and have responsibility for governance, financial oversight, DLR PPN activities, participation of PPN Representatives, and contributing to the development of the staff workplan.

Secretariat members also attend and represent DLR PPN on a range of committees and at outreach events, including the PPN National Secretariat Network, the PPN National Conference, DLR Community Awards, the Age Friendly Alliance, the DLR Age Well Expo, and the DLR PPN Representatives Network, among others.

The Secretariat met 12 times during 2025. In addition, the Human Resources and Finance subcommittees each met three times. The overall attendance rate of Secretariat members at meetings was 79%.

## Governance

In December 2025, Kay Gleeson and Aileen Eglington stepped down from the Secretariat after completing their terms of office. To these amazing people we owe an immense depth of gratitude. DLR PPN extends sincere thanks to both for their outstanding commitment and dedication to DLR PPN. We are deeply grateful for their contribution and we look forward to their continued involvement and support of DLR PPN into the future.

# Your DLR PPN Representatives



Following the formation of the new Strategic Policy Committees for the 2024–2028 term, the PPN commenced the development of a new training programme for representatives, which was delivered in February and March. Separate induction training was also provided by Dún Laoghaire–Rathdown County Council.

The newly elected representatives, together with Local Community Development Committee representatives and Secretariat members, worked on developing their mandate for the 2024–2028 term. This was informed by the Vision for Community Wellbeing, the DLR PPN Five-Year Plan, consultation with DLR PPN member groups, and feedback from outgoing representatives. ## Staff

DLR PPN is supported by two staff members and has been hosted by the DLR Chamber of Commerce since February 2025, with Southside Partnership DLR having been the previous host organisation (2015-2025).

The Network Manager, Simone Sav, is employed on a full-time basis (35 hours per week). The Development Worker, Colette Downing, is employed on a part-time basis, working four days (28 hours) per week.

The dedication and experience of our staff, who have been with DLR PPN for seven and six years respectively, ensure the ongoing stability and success of the organisation.

# Membership

Membership of Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown Public Participation Network is open to any community and voluntary group or club, environmental group and any organisation addressing issues of social exclusion, working on a voluntary, co-operative or not-for-profit basis for the benefit of the community within Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown. Applications for membership will be considered by the Secretariat of Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown Public Participation Network. Only groups or organisations who meet the membership criteria will be offered membership.

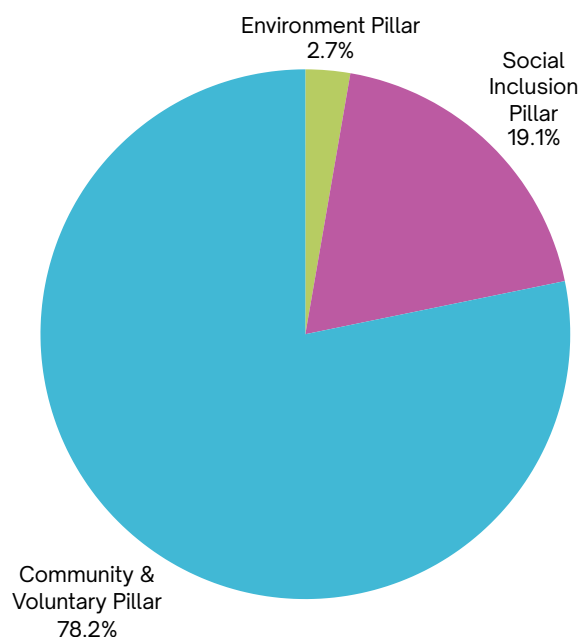
Community groups play a vital part in our community as it is their work that enhances the lives of the people in our community.

# Building Capacity

In 2025 DLR PPN provided training for its member groups on a wide variety of topics, all of which aimed to help strengthen the capacity of the Environment, Social Inclusion, Community and Voluntary PPN member groups to contribute positively to the community in which they reside or participate.

# PPN Summer School with DCU



The fourth PPN/DCU Summer School took place from 26–29 May 2025 on the DCU Glasnevin Campus and online, bringing together community volunteers, PPN Representatives, Secretariat members and staff. Delivered in partnership with the PPNs of Dublin City, Dún Laoghaire–Rathdown and Fingal, and DCU’s Office of Civic Engagement, the Summer School continued to grow in reach, ambition and impact.

The four-day programme offered practical training and policy-focused learning, including sessions on Social Media, Artificial Intelligence in Community Work, Sustainability and Energy, Misinformation, and Navigating the Irish Public Policy System.

The highlights were the panel discussion with the Department of Rural and Community Development, alongside contributions from leading academics and sector specialists.



The Summer School concluded with a networking lunch and certificate ceremony, reinforcing the strong sense of community fostered by the programme. Feedback was overwhelmingly positive, with many participants describing it as the best Summer School to date. Particular thanks are extended to Luke Quinlan for his outstanding coordination and delivery of the programme.

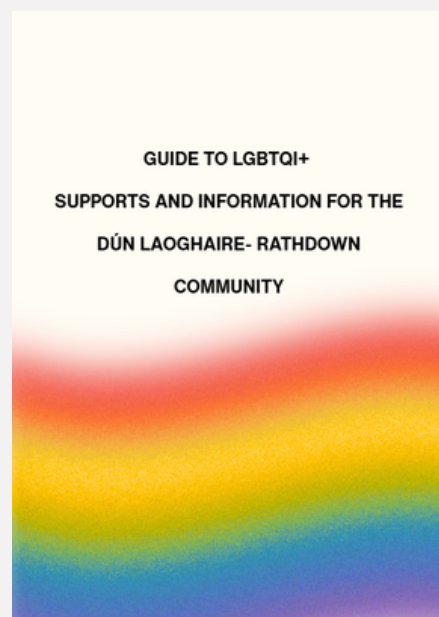
*Let's learn from one another, bridge the gaps, and build a kinder, more inclusive DLR Community.*

- Two new Secretariat members Ronan Brown and Hilda Arenas

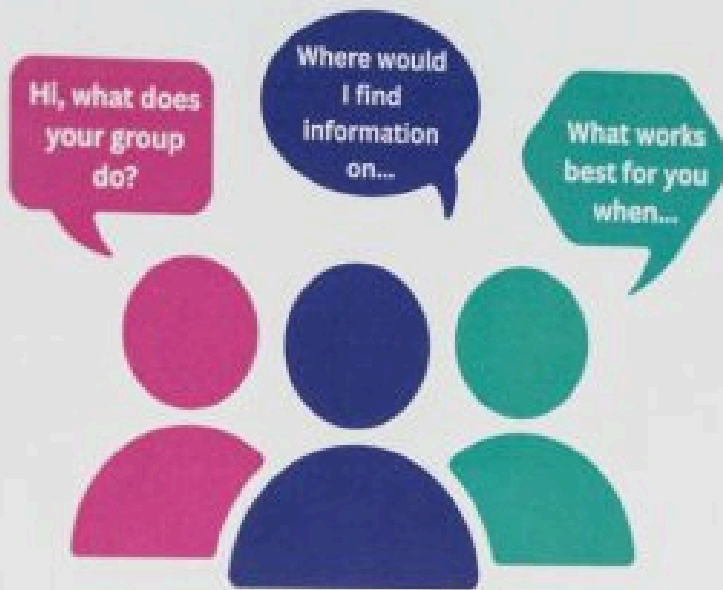

# PPN National Conference

The National PPN Conference 2025 took place in Trim, between the 16th and 17th of October and offered the opportunity for PPNs across Ireland for two days of learning, discussion and connection. DLR PPN was well represented, with five members of the PPN Secretariat and Team (Hope Adjenughure, Kay Gleeson, Gavin Harte, Ronan Browne and Simone Sav) and two members of the dlr County Council joining in (Mary Ruane and Ian Smalley).



There were two keynote sessions on Misinformation and Disinformation, delivered by the Hope and Courage Collective and the Institute for Strategic Dialogue. The presentations focused on: how misinformation spreads, how it influences public debate and how communities can respond. Workshops and site visits formed another important part of the programme.

The gala dinner, attended by Minister of State Jerry Buttimer, highlighted the positive contribution of PPNs around the country, and the positive role that PPNs play in supporting democracy at local level.

The second day of the conference offered the opportunity to learn more about the ongoing collaboration between Community, Meath PPN and Meath County Council in terms of the Trim Tidy Towns Circular Economy Strategy. The panel discussion was followed by a workshop session on four different topics.

The conference ended with feedback from workshops, and we are delighted that two DLR PPN delegates (Ronan Browne and Hope Adjenughure) shared their experience and input.

We were delighted to have had the opportunity to join this conference and we would like to extend our thanks to Meath PPN for organising and to the DRCDG team, for their amazing and ongoing support.

# Outreach

They also provide valuable opportunities for sharing experiences, strengthening local connections, and encouraging volunteerism.

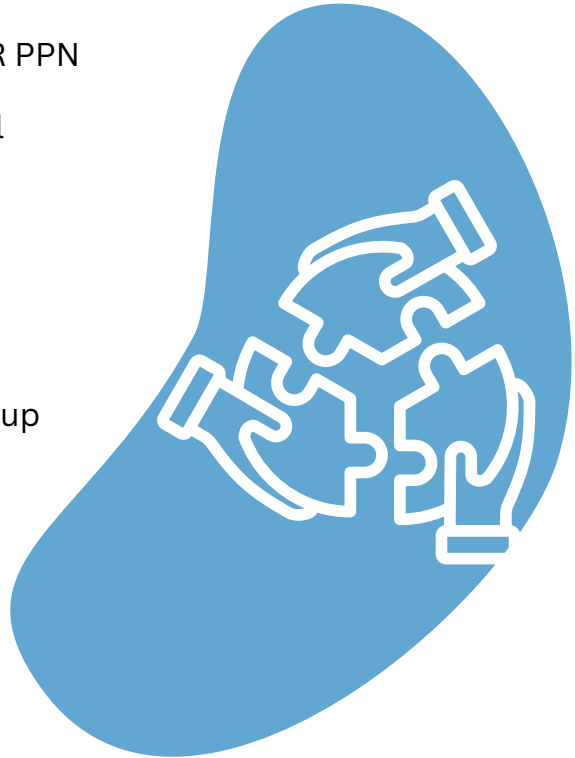
